

CCP State-Owned Enterprise Funneled Money to Sen. Jon Ossoff and the Democratic Party

A Tampa-based subsidiary of a Chinese government-controlled corporation directed contributions to Ossoff's Senate campaign and 30+ Democratic committees as part of a \$2.43 million foreign influence operation.

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THE CCP OWNERSHIP CHAIN

iGas Clean Energy, Inc., headquartered in Tampa, Florida, is a subsidiary of **Zhejiang Juhua Co., Ltd.**, a Chinese corporation listed on the Shenzhen Stock Exchange. The Zhejiang Provincial SASAC, an arm of the Chinese Communist Party, holds a **34% controlling ownership stake** in Juhua, making the CCP its largest shareholder. iGas imports HFC refrigerants manufactured in China by Juhua's facilities. Without Juhua's product supply and capital, iGas would have no inventory, no revenue, and no business.

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Adjudicated by U.S. Dept. of Commerce: The Commerce Department determined in contested adversarial proceedings, sustained through judicial review (Court of International Trade, Federal Circuit), that Juhua subsidiaries are under de facto CCP government control. Reaffirmed across **four presidential administrations (Obama, Trump I, Biden, Trump II)**.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO OSSOFF AND DEMOCRATIC COMMITTEES

Sen. Jon Ossoff (D-GA) serves on the **Senate Select Committee on Intelligence**, the **Senate Appropriations Committee**, and the **Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee**. Ossoff, who built his pre-Senate career as an investigative filmmaker documenting **foreign corruption**, received CCP-linked contributions to his own Senate campaign while sitting on the committee directly responsible for **overseeing foreign threats to U.S. national security**. Ossoff is running for reelection in 2026.

WHY OSSOFF MATTERS: THE CONFLICT

Sen. Ossoff simultaneously:

- Serves on the **Senate Select Committee on Intelligence**, the body directly responsible for overseeing foreign threats to U.S. elections and national security;
- Serves on the **Senate Appropriations Committee**, which controls federal spending including EPA enforcement budgets relevant to iGas's HFC import business;
- Serves on **Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs**, which has direct jurisdiction over foreign influence operations targeting the United States;
- Built his pre-Senate career investigating foreign corruption as CEO of Insight TWI, a documentary production company that exposed graft and fraud in foreign governments; and
- Accepted contributions from a network whose parent has been adjudicated as a CCP state-owned enterprise by the U.S. Department of Commerce.

THE GEORGIA TARGET: OSSOFF, WARNOCK, AND PARTY INFRASTRUCTURE

The iGas network did not limit its Georgia investment to Ossoff alone. The CCP-linked operation directed contributions to **three distinct Georgia Democratic entities**: Jon Ossoff for Senate (\$490 across 12 contributions), Warnock for Georgia (\$743 across 28 contributions), and the Georgia Senate Victory Fund (\$500). Combined, **\$1,733 in CCP-linked money flowed into the Georgia Democratic ecosystem** during the critical 2020-2021 election cycle when both Georgia Senate seats flipped to give Democrats their governing majority. The Georgia runoff elections determined control of the entire U.S. Senate.

HOW THE SCHEME WORKED

The iGas network used five distinct channels to distribute \$2.43 million to 147 federal committees:

CHANNEL	DETAILS
Shell LLC Network	8 commonly controlled LLCs (Cool Master Pro, BMP International, LM Supply, etc.) managed by Meng at same Tampa address
CEO Direct Giving	Xianbin "Ben" Meng (believed PRC citizen): 339 contributions totaling \$1.28M using 5 name variants and 13 employer variants
Corporate Entity	Cool Master Pro, LLC: \$687,678 in contributions as a commonly controlled entity
Coordinated Employees	Same-date, same-amount contributions by iGas VPs to identical committees (hallmark straw donor indicator)
Family Members	Kathy Xie: 28 contributions (\$1,802 via ActBlue) providing additional contribution capacity

BIPARTISAN PATTERN: HALLMARK OF FOREIGN INFLUENCE

While 94% of iGas network funds went to Republican recipients (primarily NRCC at \$715,600), the operation deliberately targeted Democratic committees. This **bipartisan distribution is a classic indicator of a foreign influence operation** designed to ensure regulatory access regardless of which party controls Congress or the White House. On October 28, 2022, Meng personally gave \$15,000 to the DCCC while Cool Master Pro LLC gave another \$15,000 to the same committee on the same day. iGas imports HFC refrigerants subject to EPA enforcement; it was fined \$382,000 by EPA in 2022 and simultaneously litigated EPA's allocation methodology in the D.C. Circuit.
